AN ACT

To provide for the Retirement of Justices of the Superior Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any justice of the superior court after having
2 held his commission as such at least ten consecu-
3 tive years and having attained the age of seventy
4 years, who shall resign his office, shall during the
5 residue of his life receive three-fourths of the
6 salary which was by law payable to him at the
7 time of his resignation, to be paid from the treas-
8 ury of the Commonwealth in the same manner as
9 the salaries of acting justices are paid.
