### AN ACT

Requiring Assessors of Taxes in Towns to post Lists  
of Persons Assessed for Poll Taxes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The assessors of taxes in each  
2 town shall on or before the first day of August  
3 in each year cause printed or written lists of all  
4 persons assessed therein for the payment of poll  
5 taxes to be prepared, and to be conspicuously  
6 posted in two or more public places in such town.  
7 In case a town is divided into voting precincts,  
8 separate lists for each precinct shall be so pre-  
9 pared and be posted in each voting precinct.  
10 The names of the persons assessed shall be ar-  
11 ranged in alphabetical order, and the lists shall,  
12 as far as practicable, be so made as to show by  
13 reference to streets and numbers thereon, or to

14 roads, or by such other definite description as  
15 may be possible, the location of the residence of  
16 each person so assessed. All such lists shall be  
17 duly certified by the assessors.

1    SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
