The Committee on Military Affairs, to whom was referred the petition of John Turk, that he may be allowed interest on a bounty which has remained in the State treasury from May 7, 1864, report the accompanying Resolve.

RESOLVE

In favor of John Turk.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid to John
2 Turk, late of company K, third regiment Massachusetts
3 heavy artillery, the sum of three hundred and ninety
4 dollars, being for interest at five per cent. per annum
5 equitably due to him on a bounty of three hundred and
6 twenty-five dollars, to which said bounty he was entitled at
7 the date of his said enlistment, but which, through no fault
8 or neglect of said Turk, was not allowed to him till the
9 second day of May, eighteen hundred and eighty-eight;
10 said sum to be paid out of the bounty loan sinking fund,
11 as provided for in chapter one hundred and twelve of the
12 Acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-two.
