RESOLVE

In addition to a Resolve relative to the Centennial Celebration of the Settlement of Ohio, and the Establishment of Civil Government in the "Northwest Territory."

1 *Resolved*, In view of the approaching celebration of
2 the centennial of the anniversary of the settlement of
3 Ohio, and the establishment of civil government in the
4 Northwest Territory, in which citizens of Massachusetts
5 were prominent, and in order to accept the invitation of
6 the legislature of Ohio to have the Commonwealth of
7 Massachusetts represented at such celebration, which has
8 been fixed for September fourth, in the year eighteen
9 hundred and eighty-eight, at Columbus, Ohio, that there
10 be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Common-
11 wealth a sum not exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars,
12 in addition to the five thousand dollars authorized by
13 chapter eighty-five of the resolves of the present year,
14 to be expended under the direction of the governor and

15 council, to enable the Commonwealth to be properly
16 represented through the following officials of the state
17 government: The governor and staff, a committee of
18 three members of the executive council, the president
19 of the senate and speaker of the house, the joint com-
20 mittee on federal relations, a special committee of five
21 senators and fifteen representatives, to be appointed by
22 the presiding officers of the two branches, the clerk of
23 the senate and clerk of the house, and the sergeant-at-
24 arms.
