AN ACT

In relation to the Schedules required to be furnished by an Insolvent Debtor to the Messenger.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 If, through accident or mistake, the schedules
2 referred to in section nineteen of chapter one hun-
3 dred and fifty-seven of the Public Statutes are not
4 delivered to the messenger within the time allowed
5 by said section, they shall be delivered as soon
6 thereafter as may be, and within such time as
7 shall enable the messenger to comply with the
8 requirements of the warrant issued under the
9 provisions of section seventeen of said chapter ;
10 and any delay or omission to deliver such sched-
11 ules to the messenger shall not affect or operate
12 to defeat the granting of the certificate of dis-
13 charge, unless such omission or delay occurs
14 through the fault of the debtor.
