AN ACT

To provide a Clerk for the District Court of Southern Berkshire and to fix the Salary of the Justice of said Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. There shall be appointed and com-
2 missioned by the governor a clerk of the district
3 court of Southern Berkshire, who shall perform
4 all the services required by law of the clerks of
5 like courts in this Commonwealth. And said
6 clerk shall receive an annual salary of three hun-
7 dred dollars, to be paid from the treasury.

1 SECT. 2. The justice of the district court of
2 Southern Berkshire, from and after the first day
3 of May next, shall receive an annual salary of
4 ten hundred dollars.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect, so far as
2 the appointment, commissioning and qualifying
3 the clerk of said court is concerned, upon its pas-
4 sage, and it shall take full effect on the first day
5 of May next.
