## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-four.

### AN ACT

To punish Persons guilty of assaulting or with violence resisting Certain Officials.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Whoever assaults, or with vio-  
2 lence resists a sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable  
3 or police officer when in the performance of his  
4 duty, shall be punished by imprisonment not less  
5 than three months, and by fine not exceeding five  
6 hundred dollars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
