AN ACT

To authorize the Town of Concord to make an Additional Water Loan.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Concord, for the
2 purposes mentioned in section four of chapter
3 one hundred and eighty-eight of the acts of the
4 year eighteen hundred and seventy-two, may
5 issue notes, bonds or scrip, to be denominated
6 on the face thereof "Concord Water Loan," to
7 an amount not exceeding twenty-five thousand
8 dollars in addition to the amounts heretofore au-
9 thorized by law to be issued by said town for the
10 same purposes; said notes, bonds or scrip to be
11 issued upon the same terms and conditions, and
12 with the same powers as are provided in said act
13 for the issue of the "Concord Water Loan" by

14 said town: *provided*, that the whole amount of
15 such notes, bonds or scrip issued by said town,
16 together with those heretofore issued by said
17 town for the same purposes, shall not, in any
18 event, exceed the amount of one hundred and
19 twenty-five thousand dollars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
