JOINT RESOLUTION OF INSTRUCTION TO SENATORS AND MEMBERS OF CONGRESS FROM VIRGINIA.

APPROVED JAN. 26, 1882.

Resolved (the House of Delegates concurring), That the Senators from Virginia be instructed, and her Representatives in Congress requested, by this General Assembly, to give their earnest support to the Bill introduced in the Senate of the United States by Hon. Henry W. Blair, entitled "A Bill to aid in the establishment and temporary support of common schools."

Resolved, That the governor of the Commonwealth be requested to transmit a copy of the foregoing Resolution to the governors of the other States, asking their co-operation, by presenting this important subject of Federal legislation to the attention of their several General Assemblies.
