The Committee on the Hoosac Tunnel and the Troy and Greenfield Railroad, to whom was referred the Order of the Senate to consider the propriety of a resolve confirming certain award on a reference made between the Troy and Greenfield Railroad, by its manager, and Patrick T. O'Reilly of Springfield, owner of certain land in Greenfield taken by said railroad, report in part the accompanying Resolve.

RESOLVE

Confirming the Award of Arbitrators in the Case between the Troy and Greenfield Railroad Company and Patrick T. O'Reilly for Land taken by said Railroad Company.

Resolved, That the award of Edmund H. Bennett, Joseph O. Proctor, and Justin Dewey, arbitrators by agreement between the manager of the Troy and Greenfield Railroad Company and Patrick T. O'Reilly, of Springfield, in the county of Hampden, for the adjustment of land taken by said railroad company, be approved, ratified, and confirmed according to the terms of said award; and that said manager be authorized to release to Patrick T. O'Reilly all the rights of the Commonwealth in a strip of land situate between the dwelling-house of the said Patrick T. O'Reilly and the fence now in front of said dwelling-house; said fence being twenty-seven and two-tenths feet from the brick foundation of said dwelling-house at the westerly corner thereof, and thirty-four and six-tenths feet from said brick foundation at the easterly corner thereof, in both cases measured by extending the side lines of said house straight to the points above designated respectively.

And said award shall be binding upon the Commonwealth, its successors, or assigns, and may be recorded in the registry of deeds for Franklin County.
