AN ACT

Concerning Cases tried without a Jury.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1 SECTION 1. When any action is tried in the
2 supreme judicial or superior court without a jury,
3 the clerk shall notify the parties thereto when a
4 decision is made; and parties shall be allowed
5 three days, after receiving such notice, in which
6 they may file exceptions, or a motion for a new
7 trial: but nothing herein contained shall be so con-
8 strued as to prevent the court from further extend-
9 ing the time as now provided by law.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
