## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-Four.

### AN ACT

Concerning the filing of Bonds for the Dissolution of  
of Attachments.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1    SECT. 1. The bond provided for in section one  
2 hundred and four of chapter one hundred and  
3 twenty-three of the General Statutes, shall be  
4 deposited by the defendant with the attaching  
5 officer, and thereupon the attachment shall be dis-  
6 solved, and such officer shall, within ten days  
7 thereafter, file said bond with the clerk of the court  
8 to which the writ is returnable or in which it is  
9 pending, and said clerk shall give said officer a  
10 certificate of the filing of the same.

1    SECT. 2. So much of section five of chapter  
2 two hundred and ninety-one of the acts of the  
3 year eighteen hundred and seventy, inconsistent  
4 herewith, is hereby repealed.

1    SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
