AN ACT

Relating to the Claim of Charles Burrill against the City
of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The city of Boston is hereby authorized
2 to refer to arbitration the claim of Charles Burrill,
3 of Brookline, for services rendered and money ex-
4 pended by him in procuring credits upon the quota of
5 volunteers of said city during the rebellion.

1 SECT. 2. Said city may pay to said Burrill in satis-
2 faction of said claim, such sum as may be determined
3 by arbitration or in any other manner, and may raise
4 the same by taxation or otherwise.
