The Committee on Towns, to whom was committed the petition of the selectmen of Lynnfield for an Act straightening and defining the boundary line between Lynnfield and Wakefield, report the accompanying Bill.

AN ACT

To define the Boundary Line between Wakefield and
Lynnfield.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The boundary line between the town of
2 Wakefield, in the county of Middlesex, and the
3 town of Lynnfield, in the county of Essex, shall be
4 established and confirmed by three commissioners, as
5 agreed upon by the said towns of Wakefield and
6 Lynnfield as hereinafter named.

1 SECT. 2. Said commissioners shall consist of the
2 following named persons, to wit, Paul H. Sweetser,
3 of Wakefield, and John Perkins and George L.
4 Hawkes, of Lynnfield, who shall have full power to
5 define the boundary between the aforesaid towns and
6 to erect suitable monuments, the expense of which

7 shall be borne by the respective towns of Wakefield
8 and Lynnfield.

1 SECT. 3. Said commissioners shall make returns
2 of their doings under this act within six months
3 from its passage.

1 SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from its pas-
2 sage.
