[Mr. BARNEY moves to substitute the following Resolve for the " Bill relating to the Jamaica Pond Aqueduct Company," (Senate 126.)]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

R E S O L V E

Relating to the Jamaica Pond Aqueduct Corporation.

Resolved, That the governor, with the advice of the council, shall appoint three competent and skilful persons, who shall, after due notice to the selectmen of West Roxbury and said corporation, proceed to ascertain and determine what legal rights the said Jamaica Pond Aqueduct Corporation acquired, if any, by the act of incorporation in eighteen hundred and fifty-seven; whether or not they have exceeded those rights—if so, how; whether or not said corporation have injured the rights of any of the citizens of West Roxbury—if so, how; whether or not there is need of further legislation in regard to said corporation, to protect the rights of individuals or the public; and to report their findings, and if they shall think further legislation is needful, to report such a bill to the next legislature.

The compensation of said commissioners shall be fixed by the governor at such sum for each day spent in the business of the commission as he shall deem just and equitable, and the amount shall be paid equally by the town of West Roxbury and said Jamaica Pond Aqueduct Corporation.
