AN ACT

To incorporate the I. Washburn and Moen Wire Works.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. Ichabod Washburn, Philip L. Moen,
2 William E. Rice, Dorance S. Goddard, Henry God-
3 dard and Peter C. Bacon, their associates and succes-
4 sors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of
5 the I. Washburn and Moen Wire Works, for the
6 purpose of manufacturing wire rods, iron and steel
7 wire, cotton yarn and cotton goods in the city of
8 Worcester, in the county of Worcester; and for that
9 purpose shall have all the powers and privileges, and
10 be subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities
11 set forth in all general laws which now are or may
12 hereafter be in force relating to manufacturing cor-
13 porations.

1 SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation
2 shall not exceed seven hundred thousand dollars, and
3 shall be divided into shares of one hundred dollars
4 each. Said corporation may hold such real and per-
5 sonal estate as may be necessary or convenient for the
6 purposes set forth in this act, and shall not commence
7 business until five hundred thousand dollars of its
8 capital stock shall have been paid in.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
