AN ACT

To change the Name of the Town of North Chelsea.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The town of North Chelsea, in the
2 county of Suffolk, shall take the name of Revere.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall not take effect unless ac-
2 cepted by a majority of the legal voters of said town,
3 present and voting thereon by ballot, at a special
4 meeting held upon notice given at least seven days
5 before the time of said meeting. And the polls shall
6 be opened at twelve o'clock, noon, of said day, and
7 shall not be closed before four o'clock in the afternoon
8 of said day, nor remain open longer than six o'clock
9 in the afternoon of said day.

1 SECT. 3. It shall be the duty of the selectmen of
2 said town to certify and return as soon as may be,
3 the number of ballots in favor of the acceptance of
4 this act, and the number of ballots against the
5 acceptance of this act, to the secretary of the Com-
6 monwealth. And if it shall appear that a majority
7 of such ballots is in favor of the acceptance of this
8 act, the said secretary shall immediately issue and
9 publish his certificate, declaring this act to have been
10 duly accepted.

1 SECT. 4. Said meeting shall be held within ninety
2 days from the passage of said act.
