### AN ACT

To better Define the Boundary Line between the Towns  
of Norfolk and Wrentham.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of  
the same, as follows:—*

1    SECT. 1. The boundary line between the town of  
2 Norfolk and the town of Wrentham is hereby estab-  
3 lished, as follows: beginning on Pine street, on the  
4 dividing line between the towns of Norfolk, Wrentham  
5 and Foxborough, on the southerly side of said street,  
6 at the bound as now established, and thence by a  
7 straight line to a point on the westerly side of Everett  
8 street, midway between the house of Edmund T.  
9 Everett and the Pondville cemetery; thence in a  
10 straight line to a point on the westerly side of North  
11 street, five rods southerly of the farm-buildings of

12 Samuel J. Benn; thence in a straight line to a point  
13 on the line between Franklin and Wrentham, ninety  
14 rods southerly of the house late of Eliphalet Law-  
15 rence.

1    SECT. 2. So much of chapter thirty-five of the acts  
2 of the year eighteen hundred and seventy as is in-  
3 consistent herewith, is hereby repealed.

1    SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its pas-  
2 sage.
