### AN ACT

To establish the boundary line between the Towns of  
Southbridge and Sturbridge.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of  
the same, as follows:—*

1    SECT. 1. The boundary line between the towns of  
2 Southbridge and Sturbridge and between the points  
3 herein named, shall hereafter be established as fol-  
4 lows, to wit: commencing at the stone monument  
5 standing on the present line north of the residence of  
6 Thomas N. Harding and running thence north twen-  
7 ty-four degrees and twenty-five minutes east, five  
8 thousand six hundred and eighty feet to a stone mon-  
9 ument standing at the north-east corner of the Sar-  
10 gent lot, so called, now owned by Provostus McKin-  
11 strey; thence east eighty-nine degrees south, seventeen

12 hundred and fifty-five feet to a stone monument stand-  
13 ing at a corner in the present line between said  
14 towns.

1   SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-  
2 sage.
