The Committee on Military Affairs, to whom was re-committed the Order relative to printing an additional edition of the "Record of the Massachusetts Volunteers from 1861 to 1865," report the accompanying Resolves.

RESOLVES

Concerning the Publication of the List of Massachusetts Officers and Soldiers in the late War.

Resolved, That the adjutant-general procure, from sources that he deems reliable, evidences of such mistakes and omissions as may exist in the published list of the officers and soldiers in the late war, make a record of the same, and cause the stereotyped plates to be corrected in conformity therewith; the expense to be paid from the unexpended balance of appropriations made under chapter ninety-eight of the resolves of eighteen hundred and sixty-six.

Resolved, That the adjutant-general, as soon as may be after the corrections provided for in the foregoing resolve are made, cause to be printed one thousand copies of said list, and distribute them as follows: three copies each, to the governor, lieutenant-governor, members of the executive council and members of the senate and house of representatives for the current political year; the remainder to be subject to his disposal.
