AN ACT

Amending Chapter Two Hundred and Sixty-five of the Acts of the Year Eighteen Hundred and Seventy-nine, concerning the Appointment of Constables of Municipal Courts of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1 SECTION 1. There shall be one constable in each
2 of the municipal courts of the Charlestown, East
3 Boston, Dorchester, West Roxbury, and Brighton
4 districts, and two constables each in the municipal
5 courts of the South Boston, and Roxbury districts,
6 to be appointed by the standing justices of said
7 court. Said constable of the municipal court of the
8 Charlestown districts shall be paid a salary of one
9 thousand dollars a year and at the same rate for any
10 part of a year.

11 Said constables of the municipal courts of the

12 Roxbury, West Roxbury, East Boston, South Boston,
13 Dorchester, and Brighton districts shall be paid a
14 salary of eight hundred dollars a year, and at the
15 same rate for any part of a year.

16 Said salaries shall be paid by the treasurer of the
17 city of Boston.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
