The Committee on Bills in the Third Reading, to whom was referred the House Bill to further provide for the support of the criminal insane by the Commonwealth, report that the same ought to pass in a new draft herewith submitted.

AN ACT

To further provide for the Support of the Criminal Insane by the Commonwealth.

[House, No. 76, in a new draft.]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows.

1 SECTION 1. Section two of chapter one hun-
2 dred and forty-eight of the acts of the year eigh-
3 teen hundred and eighty-three is hereby amended,
4 by inserting in the sixth line of said section, after
5 the words "therein," the words "or in any state
6 charitable institution to which he may be trans-
7 ferred," so as to read as follows: *Sect. 2.*
8 When a person held in prison on a charge of
9 felony is committed to a state lunatic hospital
10 under the provisions of sections fifteen or thirty
11 of chapter two hundred and thirteen, or of sec-
12 tions sixteen, nineteen or twenty of chapter two

13 hundred and fourteen, of the Public Statutes, the
14 charges for his support therein, or in any state
15 charitable institution to which he may be trans-
16 ferred, shall be paid by the Commonwealth.

1 SECT. 2. Section three of said chapter one
2 hundred and forty-eight is hereby amended, by
3 inserting after the words "commitments," in the
4 second line thereof, the words "and transfers," so
5 as to read as follows: *Sect. 3.* The provisions
6 of this act shall apply to such commitments and
7 transfers already made.
