AN ACT

To amend an Act to improve the Civil Service of the Commonwealth and the Cities thereof.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section seventeen of chapter three
2 hundred and twenty of the acts of the year
3 one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four is
4 hereby amended to read as follows:—
- 5 *Sect. 17.* Every application, in order to
6 entitle the applicant to appear for examination
7 or to be examined, must state under oath the
8 facts on the following subjects: 1. Full name,
9 residence, and post-office address. 2. Citizen-
10 ship. 3. Age. 4. Place of birth. 5. Health
11 and physical capacity for the public service. 6.
12 Right of preference by reason of military or
13 naval service. 7. Previous employment in the

14 public service. 8. Business or employment and
15 residence for the previous five years. 9. Edu-
16 cation. Such other information shall be fur-
17 nished as may reasonably be required touching
18 the applicant's fitness for the public service.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
