RESOLVE

To further amend chapter fifty-three of the Resolves of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, providing for testimonials to soldiers and sailors.

1 *Resolved*, That the adjutant-general deliver testimo-
2 nials provided for in the fifty-third chapter of the resolves
3 of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine to all sol-
4 diers and sailors who enlisted in the regular army and
5 navy prior to April sixteenth, eighteen hundred and sixty-
6 one, and who served not less than six months thereafter
7 and were honorably discharged, and who were citizens
8 of Massachusetts at the time of their enlistment.
