AN ACT

To prohibit the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor on
Labor Day.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Section one of chapter two hundred and fifty-
2 four of the acts of the year one thousand eight
3 hundred and eighty-eight is hereby amended by
4 adding after the words "Memorial day" the
5 words "or on Labor day," so that the section as
6 amended shall read as follows: *Section 1.* Any
7 common victualler having a license to sell intoxi-
8 cating liquors under either of the first three classes
9 of section ten of chapter one hundred of the Pub-
10 lic Statutes, who shall sell, give away or deliver,
11 on the licensed premises, any of such liquors on
12 Fast day, or on the thirtieth day of May, com-
13 monly called Memorial day, or on Labor day, or
14 Thanksgiving day, or on the twenty-fifth day of

15 December, commonly called Christmas day, or on
16 the twenty-sixth day of December when the said
17 Christmas day falls upon Sunday, shall be liable
18 to the penalty prescribed in section eighteen of
19 chapter one hundred of the Public Statutes, or in
20 acts in amendment thereof.
