AN ACT

To Incorporate the Somerville Firemen's Relief Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. James R. Hopkins, Bernard W.
2 Lawrence, David A. Sanborn, John E. Hill,
3 Nathaniel C. Barker, Thomas H. Daley, Edwin
4 H. Bright, James A. McLane, Frank W. Ring,
5 Charles H. Bridges, Samuel H. Stevens and
6 Irving C. Jackson, their associates and succes-
7 sors, are hereby made a corporation by the name
8 of Somerville Firemen's Relief Association, for
9 the purpose of furnishing aid and assistance to
10 such firemen, members of the fire department of
11 the city of Somerville and of said association, as
12 may have been injured by any kind of accident,
13 while in the performance of their duty as firemen,

14 and of furnishing aid in the payment of the
15 expenses of the burial of such firemen as may
16 have died while members of such department and
17 association, with all the powers and privileges
18 and subject to all the duties, liabilities and
19 restrictions set forth in all general laws which
20 now are or may hereafter be in force relating to
21 such corporations.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation for the purposes
2 aforesaid may hold real and personal estate to an
3 amount not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars in
4 value.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
