In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-three.

AN ACT

To amend an Act to enable Cities and Towns to Manufacture and Distribute Gas and Electricity.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Any city or town purchasing under the
2 provisions of chapter three hundred and seventy of the
3 acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one, a gas
4 or an electric light plant that has pipes or lines running
5 or extending into one or more adjoining towns for the
6 purpose of distributing gas or electricity may purchase
7 and hold all such pipes and lines and use the same for
8 the distribution of gas or electricity, such purchase to
9 include all franchises and other rights and privileges
10 owned and enjoyed by the vendor thereof.

1 SECT. 2. All provisions of chapter three hundred and
2 seventy of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and
3 ninety-one inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
