

[To accompany the petition of JAMES A. GALLIVAN for legislation to prohibit the employment of conductors or motormen on street railways unless they have been residents of the Commonwealth for one year prior to their employment.]

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-seven.

AN ACT

Relative to the Employment of Conductors and
Motormen by Street Railway Companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. No person shall be hereafter em-
2 ployed as conductor or motorman upon any street
3 railway car operated in this Commonwealth, unless
4 such person has resided in this Commonwealth
5 one year at the time such employment commences
6 and is a citizen of the United States. Any street
7 railway company which employs any person in
8 violation of the provisions of this act shall be
9 fined not exceeding one hundred dollars for each
10 person so employed and for each month during
11 which such employment continues.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on the first
2 day of June in the year eighteen hundred and
3 ninety-seven.
