### RESOLVE

Relative to the Tennessee Centennial and International  
Exposition.

1     *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the  
2 treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding ten  
3 thousand dollars, to be expended under the direction of  
4 the governor and council, to enable the Commonwealth  
5 to be represented at the Tennessee Centennial and Inter-  
6 national Exposition to be held in the city of Nashville,  
7 beginning on the first day of May in the year eighteen  
8 hundred and ninety-seven, through the following officials:  
9 His excellency the governor and six members of his staff,  
10 his honor the lieutenant governor, four members of the  
11 executive council, three special commissioners to be ap-  
12 pointed by the governor with the consent of the council,  
13 the secretary of the Commonwealth, the treasurer and  
14 receiver-general, the auditor of accounts, the attorney-  
15 general, the adjutant-general, the president and clerk of  
16 the senate, the speaker and clerk of the house of repre-  
17 sentatives, the sergeant-at-arms, and a special committee  
18 of eight members of the senate and eighteen members of  
19 the house of representatives to be appointed by the  
20 presiding officers of the two branches, respectively.  
21 Any vacancies occurring in said special legislative com-

22 mittee may be filled by the presiding officer of the branch  
23 in the representation of which such vacancies occur.

24 The commissioners appointed by the governor shall  
25 serve without pay, but may employ a clerk who shall  
26 receive such compensation as said commissioners may  
27 determine, provided that the same shall be paid out of  
28 the ten thousand dollars allowed by this resolve.
