AN ACT

Relative to Appointments in the Somerville Fire Department.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section one of chapter two hundred and nine
2 of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and
3 ninety-seven is hereby amended, by striking out,
4 in the second, third and fourth lines, the words
5 “enactment of chapter three hundred and twenty
6 of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and
7 eighty-four,” and by inserting in place thereof the
8 words “twenty-seventh day of June, eighteen
9 hundred and ninety-three,” so as to read as fol-
10 lows:—

11 *Section 1.* All members of the Somerville fire
12 department, known as call members, who were
13 appointed before the twenty-seventh day of June,
14 eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and who have

15 continued three or more years in said service, shall
16 upon application to the civil service commission-
17 ers, be placed upon the eligible list for appoint-
18 ment as permanent men without any further
19 examination.
