Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-seven.

RESOLVE

In favor of the Massachusetts Agricultural College.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the Commonwealth, a sum not exceeding
3 twelve thousand dollars, to be expended at the Massa-
4 chusetts Agricultural College, under the direction of its
5 trustees, for the following purposes, to wit:—for pro-
6 viding adequate water supply and protection from fire by
7 the purchase and laying of six thousand feet, more or
8 less, of six-inch cast iron water pipes, with the gates,
9 hydrants and hose required, a sum not exceeding five
10 thousand eight hundred dollars; for constructing a reser-
11 voir to be used in emergencies, and laying the necessary
12 pipes and gates, a sum not exceeding two thousand five
13 hundred dollars; for renovating and enlarging the green-
14 house for the study of plant diseases, a sum not exceed-
15 ing one thousand five hundred dollars; for enlarging the
16 laboratory and providing the necessary facilities for
17 teaching botany, a sum not exceeding one thousand dol-
18 lars; for painting, repairing and raising the roofs of the
19 greenhouses known as the Durfee plant house and the
20 vegetable house, a sum not exceeding one thousand
21 dollars.
