AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses at
the State Almshouse at Tewksbury.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for the
5 year ending on the thirty-first day of December,
6 in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-seven,
7 to wit:

8 For the payment of salaries, wages and labor
9 at the state almshouse at Tewksbury, a sum not
10 exceeding thirty-five thousand two hundred dol-
11 lars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 86.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$33,100.)

12 For current expenses at the state almshouse at
13 Tewksbury, a sum not exceeding one hundred
14 and eleven thousand five hundred dollars. [Pub.
15 Stat., chap. 86.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$100,000.)

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
