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Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

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In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-seven.

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RESOLVE

In favor of Certain Veterans of the Town of Stoneham.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the  
2 treasury of the Commonwealth the sum of one hundred  
3 and twenty-five dollars each to the following named per-  
4 sons: John Brosnaham, ninth Massachusetts volunteers;  
5 Henry Harrington, sixteenth Massachusetts volunteers;  
6 James H. Howard, first battalion heavy artillery Massa-  
7 chusetts volunteers; Charles H. Carr, twenty-second  
8 Massachusetts volunteers; Caleb O. Noble, nineteenth  
9 Massachusetts volunteers; Charles A. Holmes, thirteenth  
10 Massachusetts volunteers; Allen D. Whitman, thirteenth  
11 Massachusetts volunteers; Leonard S. Whittier, first  
12 company sharpshooters, Massachusetts volunteers;  
13 Henry Dotey, thirteenth Massachusetts volunteers;  
14 John O'Brien, ninety-ninth New York volunteers;  
15 Edward Myers, ninety-ninth New York volunteers;

16 Emmons Buck, fourth battalion light artillery, Massa-  
17 chusetts volunteers; John Q. A. Sturtevant, second com-  
18 pany sharpshooters, Massachusetts volunteers; Marcus  
19 M. Howard, United States navy; Charles F. Drew,  
20 thirteenth Massachusetts volunteers; Darius Johonnott,  
21 nineteenth Massachusetts volunteers; said persons being  
22 veterans who served in the United States army or navy  
23 in the war of the rebellion to the credit of the town  
24 of Stoneham and who never received a bounty for said  
25 service. The sum allowed by this resolve shall be paid  
26 only to the beneficiaries named herein or to their  
27 executors or administrators.
