AN ACT

To extend the Powers of the Berkshire Water Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Berkshire Water Company, incorpo-
2 rated by chapter one hundred and twenty-seven of the
3 acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty, may extend
4 its pipes into the town of Lenox for a distance not ex-
5 ceeding one-half mile from the Housatonic river and may
6 take water from Washington Mountain brook, otherwise
7 called the Basin Pond brook, in the town of Lee. In
8 making such extension of its pipes and in taking such
9 additional water supply said company shall have the
10 same rights and be subject to the same liabilities as if
11 the right to take such additional water source and to
12 make such extension of its pipes had been included in
13 the grant contained in its charter.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
