AN ACT

To prevent the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors in the Public Parks, Pleasure Grounds and Reservations within the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. No licenses for the sale of spirituous or
2 intoxicating liquors shall be granted to be exercised in
3 any public park, pleasure grounds or reservation within
4 the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

1 SECT. 2. Any person who violates any of the pro-
2 visions of this act shall be liable to the penalties provided
3 in chapter one hundred of the Public Statutes and amend-
4 ments thereof.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
