AN ACT

Relative to the Appointment of a Seventh Assistant Clerk of the Superior Court, Civil Session, for the County of Suffolk.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The justices of the superior court or a
2 majority of them may appoint a seventh assistant clerk of
3 said court for civil business in the county of Suffolk, who
4 shall be subject to the provisions of law applicable to
5 assistant clerks of courts in said county, and who shall
6 receive in full for all services performed by him an
7 annual salary of twenty-five hundred dollars, to be paid
8 by said county.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
