Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-eight.

AN ACT

To fix the Compensation of the Chairman of the Board of
Registration in Pharmacy.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Chapter three hundred and ninety-seven of the acts of
2 the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six is hereby
3 amended by inserting after the words "each way" in the
4 third section thereof the following: "The executive
5 officer of the board, whose duty it shall be to give daily
6 attendance at the office, to prepare and arrange appli-
7 cations for liquor certificates for the consideration of the
8 board at regular or special meetings, conduct hearings,
9 and to keep records of same, shall receive in addition to
10 the five dollars per day, such annual sum as shall be ap-
11 proved by the board, to be paid from the special appro-

12 priations for enforcing the law to regulate the practice
13 of pharmacy." So that said section as amended will read
14 as follows:—

15 *Section 3.* "The compensation, incidental and travel-
16 ling expenses of the board shall be paid from the treasury
17 of the Commonwealth. The compensation of the mem-
18 bers of the board shall be five dollars each for every day
19 actually spent in the discharge of their duties and the
20 amount actually paid by them for necessary travelling
21 expenses in attending the meetings of the board, but in
22 no case exceeding three cents per mile each way. The
23 executive officer of the board, whose duty it shall be to
24 give daily attendance at the office, to prepare and arrange
25 applications for liquor certificates for the consideration of
26 the board at regular or special meetings, conduct hear-
27 ings and to keep records of the same, shall receive in
28 addition to the five dollars per day such annual sum as
29 shall be approved by the board to be paid from the
30 special appropriations for enforcing the law to regulate
31 the practice of pharmacy. The bills for such compen-
32 sation and their incidental and travelling expenses shall
33 be approved by the board and sent to the auditor of the
34 Commonwealth, who shall certify to the governor and
35 council the amounts due as in case of other bills and
36 accounts approved by him under the provisions of law.
37 So much of the receipts from examinations as may be
38 necessary for the compensation and expenses of the
39 board, as aforesaid, is hereby appropriated, in addition
40 to any amount authorized by the legislature for the pur-
41 poses of this act."
