AN ACT

Relative to the printing of certain Public Documents.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. There shall be printed annually of the
2 report of the chief of the district police, twenty-five hun-
3 dred copies; of the report of the commissioner of public
4 roads, two thousand copies, of which five hundred shall
5 be for the use of the commissioner; of the report of the
6 secretary of the state board of education, five thousand
7 copies; of the state farm report of the trustees of the
8 state almshouse and state farm, twenty-five hundred
9 copies. There shall be printed annually, for the use of
10 the state board of lunacy and charity, five hundred copies
11 of so much of the annual report of said board as relates
12 to city and town almshouses, together with that portion
13 of the appendix to said report called the pauper abstract.

1 SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent
2 herewith are hereby repealed.
