In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-eight.

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Soldiers' Home in Massachusetts, the Massachusetts Charitable Eye and Ear Infirmary and for certain other Expenses Authorized by Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury
3 of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified in certain acts and
5 resolves of the present year, to wit:

6 For an additional clerk in the office of the chief
7 of the district police, as authorized by chapter
8 two hundred and nineteen of the acts of the
9 present year, a sum not exceeding four hundred
10 and seventy-five dollars.

11 For an assistant register of probate and insol-
12 vency for the county of Hampden, as authorized
13 by chapter two hundred and thirty-four of the

14 acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding
15 seven hundred and seventy-five dollars.

16 For the salary of the second assistant district
17 attorney for the Suffolk district, as authorized by
18 chapter two hundred and thirty-five of the acts of
19 the present year, the sum of eight hundred dollars,
20 the same to be in addition to the twenty-five hun-
21 dred dollars appropriated by chapter sixteen of
22 the acts of the present year.

23 For the salary and expenses of four additional
24 members of the boiler inspection department of
25 the district police, as authorized by chapter two
26 hundred and sixty-one of the acts of the present
27 year, a sum not exceeding fifty-five hundred
28 dollars.

29 For the salary of the judge of probate and in-
30 solvency for the county of Berkshire, as author-
31 ized by chapter two hundred and eighty of the
32 acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding
33 seven hundred dollars, the same to be in addition
34 to the eighteen hundred dollars appropriated by
35 chapter sixteen of the acts of the present year.

36 For the payment of the expenses of the state
37 board of bar examiners, as authorized by chapter
38 three hundred and twelve of the acts of the pres-
39 ent year, a sum not exceeding one thousand dol-
40 lars.

41 For plans, the necessary building and appli-
42 ances and such other expenses as may be neces-
43 sary to prepare for the infliction of the punishment
44 of death, as provided for by chapter three hun-
45 dred and twenty-six of the acts of the present

46 year, a sum not exceeding seventy-five hundred
47 dollars.

48 For clerical assistance for the register of pro-
49 bate and insolvency for the county of Middlesex
50 as authorized by chapter three hundred and thir-
51 ty-two of the acts of the present year, a sum not
52 exceeding one thousand dollars, the same to be in
53 addition to the thirty-five hundred dollars appro-
54 priated by chapter sixteen of the acts of the
55 present year.

56 For the salaries of two aids and one chief of
57 secret service in the office of the state fire mar-
58 shal to April twelfth, eighteen hundred and
59 ninety-eight, a sum not exceeding eight hundred
60 and seventy-five dollars. (Acts 1895, chap. 452;
61 1898, chap. 321.)

62 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
63 general superintendent of prisons, as authorized
64 by chapter three hundred and thirty-four of the
65 acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding
66 eight hundred dollars, the same to be in addition
67 to the five hundred dollars appropriated by chap-
68 ter eight of the acts of the present year.

69 For the purchase of additional land and for
70 certain repairs at the Massachusetts Reformatory,
71 as authorized by chapter twenty-seven of the re-
72 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
73 nine thousand dollars.

74 For certain repairs at the reformatory prison
75 for women, as authorized by chapter twenty-eight
76 of the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-
77 ceeding twenty-six hundred and fifty dollars.

78 For procuring a steamer to be used for the en-
79 forcement of the fish and game laws, as authorized
80 by chapter thirty of the resolves of the present
81 year, a sum not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

82 For the payment of certain expenses of the
83 annual convention of the farmers' national con-
84 gress to be held in the year eighteen hundred and
85 ninety-nine, as authorized by chapter thirty-one
86 of the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-
87 ceeding one thousand dollars.

88 For printing five hundred additional copies of
89 the tenth report of the commissioner of public
90 records, as authorized by chapter thirty-two of
91 the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-
92 ceeding fifty dollars.

93 For expenses in connection with the dedication
94 of the monument erected by the Commonwealth
95 on the battlefield of Antietam, as authorized by
96 chapter thirty-three of the resolves of the present
97 year, a sum not exceeding thirty-five hundred
98 dollars.

99 For the Myles Standish monument association,
100 as authorized by chapter thirty-six of the re-
101 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
102 five thousand dollars.

103 For certain improvements at the Taunton
104 lunatic hospital, as authorized by chapter thirty-
105 seven of the resolves of the present year, a sum
106 not exceeding two thousand dollars.

107 For Frank A. Newell, as authorized by chap-
108 ter thirty-eight of the resolves of the present
109 year, the sum of forty dollars.

110 For expenses in connection with an examina-
111 tion of the boundary line between the Com-
112 monwealth of Massachusetts and the state of
113 Connecticut, as authorized by chapter thirty-
114 nine of the resolves of the present year, a sum
115 not exceeding five hundred dollars.

116 For the purchase of suitable apparatus for the
117 practical examination of engineers and firemen,
118 as authorized by chapter forty of the resolves
119 of the present year, a sum not exceeding twenty-
120 five hundred dollars.

121 For the mother of the late James E. Hayes,
122 as authorized by chapter forty-one of the resolves
123 of the present year, the sum of seven hundred
124 and fifty dollars.

125 For Annie E. Fitzgerald, as authorized by
126 chapter forty-two of the resolves of the present
127 year, the sum of one hundred dollars.

128 For erecting cook houses on the camp ground
129 at Framingham, as authorized by chapter fifty-
130 one of the resolves of the present year, a sum
131 not exceeding thirty-two hundred dollars.

132 For the establishment of an electric light plant
133 at the state prison, as authorized by chapter
134 fifty-four of the resolves of the present year, a
135 sum not exceeding thirteen thousand dollars.

136 For the purchase of equipment for the first
137 regiment of heavy artillery, as authorized by
138 chapter fifty-six of the resolves of the present
139 year, a sum not exceeding thirty-five hundred
140 dollars.

141 For the construction of a new school building

142 at the Lyman school for boys, as authorized by
143 chapter fifty-seven of the resolves of the present
144 year, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand
145 dollars.

146 For printing the report, with appendices, of
147 the special committee appointed to investigate
148 the subject of the relations between cities and
149 towns and street railway corporations, as au-
150 thorized by chapter fifty-eight of the resolves of
151 the present year, a sum not exceeding seven
152 hundred dollars.

153 For the publication of the proceedings com-
154 memorating the centennial of the Bulfinch state
155 house, as authorized by chapter fifty-nine of the
156 resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding
157 two thousand dollars.

158 For the establishment of a fish hatchery in the
159 county of Berkshire, as authorized by chapter
160 sixty of the resolves of the present year, a sum
161 not exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars.

162 For Minnie E. Squire, as authorized by chapter
163 sixty-one of the resolves of the present year, the
164 sum of one thousand dollars.

165 For Eben S. Curtis, as authorized by chapter
166 sixty-two of the resolves of the present year, the
167 sum of twenty-five hundred dollars, to be paid
168 out of the metropolitan parks loan fund.

169 For the purchase of land at the Westborough
170 Insane Hospital, as authorized by chapter sixty-
171 three of the resolves of the present year, a sum
172 not exceeding forty-four hundred forty-two
173 dollars and thirty-two cents.

174 For the Massachusetts Charitable Eye and Ear
175 Infirmary, as authorized by chapter sixty-four of
176 the resolves of the present year, the sum of
177 twenty-five thousand dollars.

178 For certain improvements at the Massachu-
179 setts School for the Feeble-minded, as authorized
180 by chapter sixty-five of the resolves of the
181 present year, a sum not exceeding three thou-
182 sand dollars.

183 For the Massachusetts School for the Feeble-
184 minded, as authorized by chapter sixty-six of
185 the resolves of the present year, the sum of ten
186 thousand dollars, the same to be in addition to
187 the twenty-five thousand dollars appropriated
188 by chapter twenty-five of the acts of the present
189 year.

190 For Hobart W. Cummings, as authorized by
191 chapter sixty-seven of the resolves of the pres-
192 ent year, the sum of one hundred and eighteen
193 dollars.

194 For printing Bradford's history of the Ply-
195 mouth plantation, as authorized by chapter sixty-
196 eight of the resolves of the present year, a sum
197 not exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars, the
198 same to be in addition to the sum provided for
199 in chapter ninety-one of the resolves of the
200 year eighteen hundred and ninety-seven.

201 For John C. Irish, as authorized by chapter
202 sixty-nine of the resolves of the present year,
203 the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars.

204 For printing the report of the commissioners
205 appointed to inquire into the expediency of

206 revising and amending the laws of the Com-
207 monwealth relating to taxation, as authorized
208 by chapter seventy of the resolves of the pres-
209 ent year, a sum not exceeding three hundred
210 and fifty dollars.

211 For the trustees of the Soldiers' Home in
212 Massachusetts, as authorized by chapter seventy-
213 two of the resolves of the present year, the sum
214 of thirty-five thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon
2 its passage.
