

HOUSE No. 319.

[Bill accompanying the petition of CHARLES H. UPSON. Liquor Law.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-nine.

AN ACT

Relative to the Carriage of Liquors by Common Carriers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. No expressman or other common carrier
2 shall transport liquor for hire or gratuitously to a city or
3 town in which the sale of liquor is not licensed, unless
4 he has first procured from the mayor of such city or the
5 selectmen of such town a license to act as a common
6 carrier in or to such city or town. This act shall not
7 affect any express companies acting as common carriers
8 between two or more states.

1 SECTION 2. A common carrier who violates the pro-
2 visions of this act shall be punished by a fine of not less
3 than ten and not more than twenty-five dollars for each
4 offence.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
