AN ACT

To authorize the Construction of a Parkway in the Town of Revere and the Cities of Chelsea and Everett.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan park commission is  
2 hereby authorized to extend the roadway and boulevard  
3 within and connecting with the reservation at Crescent  
4 Beach, through the town of Revere, and the cities of  
5 Chelsea and Everett, to Broadway in the city of Everett,  
6 and to construct such bridges as may be necessary to  
7 connect different parts of such roadway or boulevard so  
8 extended.

1 SECTION 2. To meet any expenditures under the  
2 authority of this act, the treasurer and receiver-general  
3 shall issue scrip and certificates of indebtedness, or

4 bonds, as an addition to the metropolitan parks loan,  
5 series two, to an amount not exceeding four hundred  
6 thousand dollars.

7 The sinking fund already established by law shall also  
8 be maintained for the purpose of extinguishing scrip,  
9 certificates or bonds issued under the authority of this  
10 act. Any premium realized on the sale of such scrip,  
11 certificates or bonds, shall be applied to the payment of  
12 the interest on the loan hereby authorized, as it accrues.  
13 Said scrip, certificates or bonds, shall be issued, and  
14 said sinking fund assessed and collected in accordance  
15 with the provisions of chapter two hundred and eighty-  
16 eight of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and  
17 ninety-four, and of chapter five hundred and fifty of the  
18 acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six.

1 SECTION 3. No persons except citizens of this Com-  
2 monwealth shall be employed on the work authorized by  
3 this act.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its pas-  
2 sage.
