## AN ACT

## Relative to Auctioneers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section one of chapter sixty-seven of the
- 2 Public Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and
- 3 eighty-nine of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and
- 4 eighty-six, is hereby amended by striking out in the
- 5 second line thereof the words, "by writing under their
- 6 hands," so as to read as follows : -
- 7 Section 1. The mayor and aldermen or selectmen of
- ·8 any city or town may license one or more suitable per-
- 9 sons, who have resided in their respective cities and towns
- 10 for a period of six months before application is made for
- 11 such license, to be auctioneers within the same for the
- 12 term of one year, and may receive to the use of the city
- 13 or town for each license two dollars. They shall record
- 14 every license in a book to be kept by them for that pur-
- 15 pose.
