Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-nine.

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Trustees of the Soldiers' Home in Massachusetts, the New England Industrial School for Deaf Mutes and for certain other expenses authorized by law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are provided, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified in certain acts and
5 resolves of the present year, to wit:—
6 For expenses in connection with the law to
7 provide for the payment of bounties to Massa-
8 chusetts soldiers from the treasury of the Com-
9 monwealth, as authorized by chapters five hundred
10 and twenty-five of the acts of the year eighteen
11 hundred and ninety-eight and seventy-five of the
12 acts of the present year, a sum not exceeding
13 twelve hundred dollars.

14 For the payment of the expenses of the state
15 board of bar examiners, as authorized by chapter
16 three hundred and twelve of the acts of the year
17 eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, a sum not
18 exceeding one thousand dollars.

19 To provide school registers and other school
20 blanks for the towns and cities of the Common-
21 wealth, as authorized by chapter one hundred
22 and eleven of the acts of the present year, a
23 sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.

24 For such additional clerical assistance and for
25 such expenses of the bureau of statistics of labor
26 as may be necessary, as authorized by chapter
27 one hundred and fifteen of the acts of the present
28 year, a sum not exceeding seventy-eight hundred
29 dollars, the same to be in addition to the six
30 thousand dollars appropriated by chapter forty-
31 one of the acts of the present year.

32 For expenses in connection with the boundary
33 line between the towns of Gay Head and Chil-
34 mark, as authorized by chapter one hundred and
35 thirty-three of the acts of the present year, a sum
36 not exceeding five thousand dollars.

37 For the preservation of the war records in the
38 office of the adjutant general, as authorized by
39 chapter three of the resolves of the present year,
40 a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars.

41 For completing the index of the war records
42 and re-writing the war record books in the office
43 of the adjutant general, as authorized by chapter
44 four of the resolves of the present year, the sum
45 of twenty-five hundred dollars.

46 For making surveys and plans of the state
47 house grounds and of lands and buildings adja-
48 cent thereto, and for furnishing estimates of the
49 value of such adjacent lands, as authorized by
50 chapter five of the resolves of the present year, a
51 sum not exceeding four thousand dollars.

52 For Frank L. Garland, as authorized by chapter
53 six of the resolves of the present year, the sum of
54 six hundred dollars.

55 For the purchase of apparatus to be used at
56 polling places in the canvass and count of votes,
57 as authorized by chapter seven of the resolves of
58 the present year, a sum not exceeding one thou-
59 sand dollars.

60 For compiling, indexing and publishing the
61 records of the Massachusetts troops who served
62 in the revolutionary war, as authorized by chapter
63 eight of the resolves of the present year, a sum
64 not exceeding three thousand dollars.

65 For repairs and improvements at the state
66 normal school at Bridgewater, as authorized by
67 chapter nine of the resolves of the present year,
68 a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars.

69 For Samuel Hillman, as authorized by chapter
70 ten of the resolves of the present year, the sum
71 of two hundred dollars.

72 For Lemuel Burr, as authorized by chapter
73 eleven of the resolves of the present year, the
74 sum of one hundred and fifty dollars.

75 For the purchase of land for the Massachusetts
76 hospital for consumptives and tubercular patients,
77 as authorized by chapter sixteen of the resolves

78 of the present year, a sum not exceeding twenty-
79 five hundred dollars.

80 For the New England industrial school for
81 deaf mutes, as authorized by chapter seventeen
82 of the resolves of the present year, the sum of
83 two thousand dollars.

84 For the trustees of the soldiers' home in Massa-
85 chusetts, as authorized by chapter eighteen of the
86 resolves of the present year, the sum of thirty-
87 five thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
