RESOLVE

To provide for a New Building at the Lyman School for
Boys.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding
3 twenty-one thousand dollars, to be expended under the
4 direction of the trustees of the Lyman and industrial
5 schools for the purpose of constructing and equipping
6 a new building, to include workshops, laundry and
7 kitchen, for the use of the Lyman school for boys.
