AN ACT

To authorize the City of Fall River to incur Indebtedness beyond the Limit fixed by Law for a Textile School.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The city of Fall River may incur in-
2 debtedness beyond the limit fixed by law to an amount
3 not exceeding fifty thousand dollars for the purpose of
4 acquiring land for a textile school, and of constructing
5 and equipping the same; but the provisions of chapter
6 twenty-nine of the Public Statutes, and of all acts in
7 amendment thereof, shall, so far as they may be applic-
8 able, apply to the indebtedness hereby authorized, and
9 to any securities issued therefor.

1 SECTION 2. Said city of Fall River is hereby author-
2 ized to appropriate the sum of fifty thousand dollars for
3 the aforesaid purpose; but nothing in this act shall be
4 construed as authorizing the payment from the treasury
5 of the Commonwealth of any sum in excess of that
6 authorized by statute in such cases.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
