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In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-nine.

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### RESOLVE

To provide a Building for Female Prisoners and Certain Other Improvements at the State Farm, and for the Purchase of Farm Lands and Cows.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the  
2 treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding nine-  
3 teen thousand dollars to be expended at the state farm  
4 under the direction of the trustees and superintendent,  
5 for the following purposes:—For the erection of a  
6 building for female prisoners to contain not less than  
7 twenty-five single rooms, a sum not exceeding eight  
8 thousand dollars; for providing detached sanatories for  
9 four wards, a sum not exceeding twenty-four hundred  
10 dollars; for the purchase of lands, a sum not exceeding  
11 five thousand dollars; for the purchase of not less than  
12 forty cows, and completing cow and stock barns, a sum  
13 not exceeding thirty-six hundred dollars.
