AN ACT

To authorize the Town of Winthrop to incur Indebtedness beyond the Limit fixed by Law, for the Purpose of constructing, in Conjunction with the Metropolitan Park Commission, a Shore Road.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Winthrop, for the
2 purpose of laying out and constructing, in con-
3 junction with the metropolitan park commission,
4 a shore road in said town between Great Head
5 and Grover's cliff, and of securing the adjacent
6 beach as a public reservation, may incur indebt-
7 edness beyond the limit fixed by law to an amount
8 not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, and may is-
9 sue bonds, notes and scrip therefor. Such bonds,
10 notes or scrip shall be payable within such period
11 not exceeding thirty years from the date thereof
12 and shall bear such rate of interest as the select-
13 men or a meeting of the town shall determine.

1 SECTION 2. The said town is authorized to
2 enter into agreements with said commission for
3 carrying out the purposes above mentioned, and
4 to that end is hereby authorized and empowered to
5 pay over from time to time, as it may see fit, such
6 portion or the whole of the amount that may be
7 borrowed under the provisions of this act to the
8 treasurer and receiver-general of the Common-
9 wealth, to be placed by him to the credit of and
10 added to the funds provided by law for meeting
11 the expenses of said metropolitan park commis-
12 sion, and such sum or sums paid over as aforesaid
13 may be expended by said commission in addition
14 to any loans or appropriations authorized for park
15 purposes.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect when it
2 is accepted by the said town at a meeting duly
3 warned and held for that purpose.
