AN ACT

Relative to the construction of a Boulevard from the Town of Dedham to the Stony Brook Reservation in the Town of Hyde Park.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan park commis-
2 sion is hereby authorized and instructed to inves-
3 tigate the advisability of taking lands for and
4 constructing a road or boulevard between the
5 town of Dedham and the Stony brook reserva-
6 tion of the metropolitan park system, from Boy-
7 den's square in East Dedham, in the town of
8 Dedham, being the junction of High street, Wal-
9 nut street, Milton street, Bussey street and Central
10 street in the said town of Dedham, over said
11 Central street and across Mother brook to the
12 junction of Emmett avenue and Oakland street,
13 thence to and over private lands to the Hyde
14 Park line and in the said town of Hyde Park to

15 the Stony brook reservation of the metropolitan
16 park system. Said commission shall consider the
17 cost of construction, and shall report the result of
18 its investigation, together with its recommenda-
19 tions, to the next general court. Any expense
20 incurred under this act shall be deducted from
21 the unexpended balance of the general appropria-
22 tion for metropolitan boulevards.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
