### AN ACT

Making appropriations for Expenses authorized the Present Year and for certain Other Expenses authorized by Law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,  
4 for the purposes specified in certain acts and  
5 resolves of the present year and for certain other  
6 expenses authorized by law, to wit: —

7 For the establishment of textile schools, as  
8 authorized by chapter two hundred and ninety-  
9 nine of the acts of the present year, a sum not  
10 exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars.

11 For the salaries of the retired justices of the  
12 supreme judicial court, as authorized by chapter  
13 three hundred and ten of the acts of the present  
14 year, a sum not exceeding eighty-one hundred  
15 dollars.

16 For the salaries of retired justices of the su-  
17 perior court, as authorized by chapter three hun-  
18 dred and ten of the acts of the present year, a  
19 sum not exceeding three thousand dollars.

20 For printing and distribution of additional  
21 copies of the blue book, as authorized by chapter  
22 three hundred and thirty-six of the resolves of  
23 the present year, a sum not exceeding one thou-  
24 sand dollars, the same to be in addition to the  
25 seven thousand dollars appropriated by chapter  
26 one hundred and sixty of the acts of the present  
27 year.

28 For the city of Waltham for the annual assess-  
29 ment due from the Commonwealth towards main-  
30 taining and operating a system of sewage dis-  
31 posal at the Massachusetts School for the Feeble-  
32 minded, the sum of five hundred eighty-nine dol-  
33 lars and eighty-two cents, the same to be in addi-  
34 tion to the five hundred twenty-six dollars and  
35 eight cents appropriated by chapter thirty-six of  
36 the acts of the present year. (Acts 1893, chap.  
37 83.)

(Appropriation 1898, \$526.08.)

38 To provide for a new building at the State  
39 Industrial School for Girls, as authorized by chap-  
40 ter forty-six of the resolves of the present year, a  
41 sum not exceeding eighteen thousand dollars.

42 For a new building at the Lyman School for  
43 Boys, as authorized by chapter forty-seven of the  
44 resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
45 twenty-one thousand dollars.

46 For printing additional copies of Bradford's

47 History of the Plymouth Plantation, as authorized  
48 by chapter forty-eight of the resolves of the pre-  
49 sent year, a sum not exceeding thirty-five hun-  
50 dred dollars.

51 For certain improvements at the Massachusetts  
52 Hospital for Epileptics, as authorized by chapter  
53 forty-nine of the resolves of the present year, a  
54 sum not exceeding twenty-eight hundred and  
55 fifty dollars.

56 For Alfred Bickford, as authorized by chapter  
57 fifty of the resolves of the present year, the sum  
58 of one hundred dollars.

59 For a farm building at the Medfield Insane  
60 Asylum, as authorized by chapter fifty-two  
61 of the resolves of the present year, a sum not  
62 exceeding twenty thousand dollars.

63 For Jesse A. Viles, as authorized by chapter  
64 fifty-four of the resolves of the present year, the  
65 sum of thirty-four dollars.

66 For the Lowell Textile School, as authorized  
67 by chapter fifty-five of the resolves of the present  
68 year, the sum of eighteen thousand dollars.

69 For building a practice school in connection  
70 with the State Normal School at Westfield, as  
71 authorized by chapter fifty-six of the resolves of  
72 the present year, a sum not exceeding thirty  
73 thousand dollars.

74 For expenses in connection with the disposal  
75 of the material of the educational museum, as  
76 authorized by chapter fifty-eight of the resolves  
77 of the present year, a sum not exceeding five  
78 hundred dollars.



79 For Samuel T. Davis, as authorized by chap-  
80 ter fifty-nine of the resolves of the present year,  
81 the sum of three hundred and fifty-nine dollars.

82 To provide suitable apparatus for the State  
83 Normal School at Lowell, as authorized by chap-  
84 ter sixty of the resolves of the present year, a  
85 sum not exceeding five thousand dollars.

86 For cleaning and painting the original build-  
87 ing of the State Normal Art School in the city  
88 of Boston, as authorized by chapter sixty-one of  
89 the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-  
90 ceeding eighteen hundred dollars.

91 For certain repairs and furnishings at the State  
92 Normal Art School, as authorized by chapter  
93 sixty-two of the resolves of the present year, a  
94 sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars.

95 For a state exhibit of drawing in the public  
96 schools, as authorized by chapter sixty-four of  
97 the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-  
98 ceeding fifteen hundred dollars.

99 For expenses in considering the general sub-  
100 ject of the discharge of sewage into Boston harbor  
101 under the direction of the State Board of Health,  
102 as authorized by chapter sixty-five of the re-  
103 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
104 ten thousand dollars.

105 For certain alterations and additions at the  
106 asylum for insane criminals at the State Farm,  
107 as authorized by chapter sixty-six of the re-  
108 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
109 twenty-eight thousand dollars.

110 For certain improvements at the State Farm

111 and for the purchase of farm lands and cows at  
112 the State Farm, as authorized by chapter sixty-  
113 seven of the resolves of the present year, a sum  
114 not exceeding nineteen thousand dollars.

115 For the erection of a cold storage building at  
116 the Northampton Insane Hospital, as authorized  
117 by chapter sixty-eight of the resolves of the  
118 present year, a sum not exceeding twelve thou-  
119 sand dollars.

120 For electric lights for the Worcester Insane  
121 Asylum, as authorized by chapter sixty-nine of  
122 the resolves of the present year, a sum not ex-  
123 ceeding twelve thousand dollars.

124 For the Massachusetts Agricultural College,  
125 as authorized by chapter seventy of the resolves  
126 of the present year the sum of ten thousand  
127 dollars.

128 For the purchase of land, the erection of  
129 buildings and for certain improvements at  
130 the state almshouse, as authorized by chapter  
131 seventy-one of the resolves of the present year,  
132 a sum not exceeding thirty-eight thousand nine  
133 hundred dollars.

134 For expenses of summer institutes for teach-  
135 ers, as authorized by chapter seventy-two of the  
136 resolves of the present year, a sum not exceed-  
137 ing five hundred dollars.

138 For the erection of a building for a model and  
139 practice school in connection with the state nor-  
140 mal school at Fitchburg, as authorized by chap-  
141 ter seventy-four of the resolves of the present

142 year, a sum not exceeding twenty thousand  
143 dollars.

144 For reclaiming and improving waste and un-  
145 used land with the labor of prisoners from jails  
146 and houses of correction, as authorized by chap-  
147 ter seventy-six of the resolves of the present  
148 year, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand  
149 dollars.

150 For John O'Neil, as authorized by chapter  
151 seventy-seven of the resolves of the present  
152 year, the sum of two hundred dollars.

153 For printing extra copies of the report of the  
154 Massachusetts highway commission, as author-  
155 ized by chapter seventy-nine of the resolves of  
156 the present year, a sum not exceeding seven  
157 hundred dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
