In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-nine.

AN ACT

Relative to the selling of Ice.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. No person or corporation shall
2 engage in the business of selling ice at retail to
3 be delivered in a city or town in a vehicle, unless
4 he has an annual license therefor from the board
5 of health in such city or the board of selectmen
6 in such town. The license fee shall be the sum
7 of one dollar.

1 SECTION 2. Every such license shall be on the
2 condition that the seller and the person in charge
3 of the delivery of his ice from any such vehicle

4 shall conform to the provisions of chapter two
5 hundred and seventy-six of the acts of the year
6 eighteen hundred and ninety, and shall furnish
7 to any person applying therefor to the person
8 having charge of such delivery, ice in such reas-
9 onable quantities as shall be so applied for, and the
10 license shall be on such other reasonable con-
11 ditions as said officer may deem just and proper.

1 SECTION 3. Any person or corporation un-
2 reasonably violating any provision of this act, or
3 of any reasonable condition of such license, may
4 at the discretion of the officer granting the license,
5 be deprived thereof, and shall be further liable to
6 a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars for each
7 offence on complaint to any police, district or
8 municipal court or trial justice, within whose
9 jurisdiction the offence may be committed.
